Section 1. This Council hereby confirms the granting of a conditional use permit by the City Planning Commission at its meeting on June 2, 1997, for the construction of a U.S. Post Office and distribution facility at 3675 Warrensville Center Road.

Section 2. This Council further confirms the granting of a building height variance by the Board of Zoning Appeals at its meeting on June 2, 1997, relative to this U.S. Post Office use.

Section 3. The approvals granted herein are expressly conditioned upon the following:

1. Pilasters shall be added to the north and south building elevations.
2. Instructional signs and lighting shall be code compliant.
3. Creeping vines shall be planted so as to attach to the perimeter north fencing.
4. Landscaping across the rear fence line shall be increased, as approved by Planning and Development Department staff.
5. Two landscaped islands shall be installed in the rear parking lot, as approved by Planning and Development Department staff.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect from and after the earliest time allowed by law.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Shaker Heights, State of Ohio:

Section 1. This Council hereby confirms the approval given by the City Planning Commission at its meeting on May 12, 1997, for a temporary use, consisting of a temporary wireless communications facility, by AT&T Wireless Services, to be located at Shaker Heights City Hall, 3400 Lee Road, Shaker Heights, Ohio. The approval granted herein is expressly conditioned upon the following:

1. The communications facility (pole) shall replace the current City Hall monopole, and be located approximately seven (7) feet from the current monopole, as approved by the Director of Planning and Development.
2. The communications facility shall not exceed the height of the current pole at City Hall.
3. The temporary use shall expire when a permanent wireless communications facility is constructed within the City or on December 31, 1997, whichever occurs first.
4. The temporary use shall comply with the terms and conditions of the agreement between the City and AT&T Wireless Services permitting the construction of this temporary communications facility as approved by City Council.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare for the reason that it is necessary in the current operation of the City and, therefore, this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment and approval by the Mayor.

The approval granted herein is expressly conditioned upon the following:

1. The communications facility (pole) shall replace the current City Hall monopole, and be located within five (5) feet from the current monopole, as approved by the Director of Planning and Development.
2. The communications facility shall not exceed the height of the current pole at City Hall.
3. The temporary use shall expire when a permanent wireless communications facility is constructed within the City or on December 31, 1997, whichever occurs first.
4. The temporary use shall comply with the terms and conditions of the agreement between the City and AT&T Wireless Services permitting the construction of this temporary communications facility as approved by City Council.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare for the reason that it is necessary in the current operation of the City and, therefore, this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment and approval by the Mayor.

Authorizing an agreement with AT&T Wireless Services for a temporary wireless communications facility.

WHEREAS, AT&T Wireless Services (AT&T) has applied to the Shaker Heights City Planning Commission for a conditional use permit for the installation of a permanent wireless communications facility (i.e., monopole) at 3400 Lee Road (Shaker Heights City Hall), and is negotiating with the City for the use of its property for this purpose; and

WHEREAS, this Council has determined that additional time is needed to evaluate AT&T's proposal, and to review possible alternative sites for its permanent communications facility; and

WHEREAS, AT&T has indicated an immediate need to install at least a temporary wireless communications facility in order to commence its area-wide communications system as soon as possible; and

WHEREAS, AT&T has proposed to replace the City's existing communications monopole located at City Hall with a new monopole of the same height, upon which would be mounted antennae for its temporary use, and the City's safety communications antennae, and which monopole would become the permanent property of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Shaker Heights, State of Ohio:

Section 1. The Mayor and the Director of Finance are hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with AT&T for the installation and operation of a temporary wireless communications facility at City Hall, 3400 Lee Road. Said agreement shall be in substantially the form as attached hereto and included herein by reference, as approved by the Director of Law.

Section 2. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare for the reason that it is necessary in the current operation of the City and, therefore, this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment and approval by the mayor.

Dear Mr. Schuchart:

This letter is to serve as a confirmation of the solution for a temporary wireless telecommunications facility for AT&T Wireless Services, which was proposed during the City Council work session on May 27th and the Council meeting on June 17th, 1997. The agreement between AT&T Wireless and the City of Shaker Heights (referred to as the City) will incorporate the following conditions:

1. AT&T Wireless will replace the City's existing red and white striped monopole next to the Annex building, with a monopole of equal height and galvanized gray color (the estimated value of the new monopole installed is \$34,000.00). AT&T will dispose of the pole to be replaced at no cost to the City (the cost for this service may be up to \$13,000.00, depending upon the laboratory results with respect to the toxicity of the materials of which the pole is composed).
2. The City will provide space within the Annex building for equipment for the facility. AT&T Wireless will be responsible for the utility costs that are separately metered for the Annex building during the period of temporary occupancy and will arrange to have the charges billed directly to AT&T Wireless during that time. In the event the City needs to occupy the Annex Building, AT&T Wireless will provide all Building and Fire Code improvements necessary to the area being occupied by AT&T Wireless' equipment to allow for such occupancy. AT&T Wireless will be responsible for the payment of real estate taxes and assessments, if any, resulting from its temporary use of the monopole. AT&T Wireless will also indemnify the City, its officers and employees, against any and all claims related to its construction and temporary use of the monopole, including but not limited to personal injury and property damage. It will also provide to the City a certificate of insurance, naming the City as a co-insured, in a form, and in an amount of coverage, as approved by the City's Director of Law.
3. AT&T Wireless' antennae will be located at the top of the new monopole with the positions of the City's antennae to be designated by the City's radio consultant or other City representatives. If feasible, after consultation with the City's radio consultant, certain of the City's antennae may be collocated with AT&T Wireless' antennae at the top of the monopole. The maximum diameter of the monopole will be 24 inches. AT&T Wireless' antennae and equipment shall comply with all applicable FCC requirements and regulations, including but not limited to radio transmission and safety requirements.
4. AT&T Wireless will perform a "hot cutover" of the cables for the City's Safety Services radio equipment in order to avoid any loss of service.
5. The ownership of the tower will be turned over to the City after completion of construction and the monopole is operational. All warranties provided by the manufacturer relative to the monopole, if any shall be provided to and/or assigned to the City.


6. The monopole will be donated to the City by AT&T Wireless in lieu of rent. AT&T Wireless will occupy a designated and specific area within the Annex building and will utilize the replacement monopole until a permanent antenna facility has been constructed and is fully operational or until December 31, 1997, whichever occurs first. AT&T Wireless may utilize the replacement monopole after December 31, 1997, upon the written consent of the City.
7. If the solution for the permanent wireless telecommunications facility eliminates the need for the new monopole described in item number one, AT&T Wireless will remove and dispose of the monopole and restore the area of the monopole installation at no cost to the city.

In order to expedite this process, AT&T Wireless is requesting copies of record drawings for the proposed tower area and the City's permission to perform soils testing to produce plans for the proposed monopole and equipment area, with the clear understanding that such soils testing will be done in coordination with the City so as not to interfere with the City's access to and use of the City hall driveways and parking areas. Since the long-term beneficiary of the proposed tower will be the city if a permanent location at City Hall is not constructed, AT&T Wireless requests that the City secure any building permits required for the installation. AT&T Wireless will bear the burden of costs associated with construction. Please realize this proposal is schedule driven and our ability to extend this proposal is limited to approximately two weeks.

AT&T Wireless Acknowledges that it will be responsible for all code compliant measures necessary in relation to the issuance of City permits, and that it will be responsible for the cost of such code compliance, including but not limited to electrical service and fire prevention requirements.

If these terms are acceptable to you, please sign and return this letter to me at your earliest convenience. Thank you again for your time and consideration in this most important matter. We look forward to a mutually beneficial relationship with the City of Shaker Heights. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to contact me at 716-3594.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article VI, Section 7 of the Shaker Heights City Charter, Council may authorize the expenditure of funds in excess of \$10,000 without public bidding in cases of urgent emergency, for the immediate protection of public property or public safety; and

WHEREAS, due to the public nuisance created by the spread of Dutch Elm Disease in the City of Shaker Heights, diseased trees must be removed as soon as possible after inspection and discovery of the infection; and

WHEREAS, for the reasons set forth herein, there is insufficient time to advertise for and solicit formal bids; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Service has requested authorization from Council to solicit and receive informal bids for the emergency removal of diseased elm trees, on an as-needed basis, and further, that the City be authorized to expend funds in excess of \$10,000 for such purposes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Shaker Heights, State of Ohio:

Section 1. Pursuant to Article VI, Section 7 of the City Charter, this Council hereby finds and declares that an emergency exists and that, to prevent a public nuisance, it is necessary to immediately remove diseased elm trees within the City without formal public bidding.

Section 2. The Director of Public Service is hereby authorized and directed to solicit informal bids, and to accept the lowest and best bids received, on an as-needed basis, for the immediate removal of elm trees found to be infected with the Dutch Elm Disease.

Section 3. The Mayor and the Director of Finance are hereby authorized and directed to enter into such contracts as may be necessary for the immediate removal of diseased elm trees within the City, and to expend funds therefor, in accordance with this ordinance.

Section 4. The costs for the removal of diseased elm trees, as authorized herein, shall not exceed TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$200,000).

Section 5. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare for the reason that it is necessary in the current operation of the City and further, that it is necessary to immediately remove trees infested with Dutch Elm Disease, which is contagious to healthy trees, and as such constitutes a public nuisance requiring the immediate abatement thereof and, therefore, this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment and approval by the Mayor.

Section 2. The plans, specifications and estimates of said improvement now on file in the office of the Director of Service be and the same are hereby approved.

Section 3. Two percent (2%) of the entire cost of said tree trimming and maintenance, plus the cost of trimming and maintenance in street intersections, shall be paid for by the City, the entire remainder of said cost and expense shall be assessed on all the lots and lands bounding and abutting the streets and public places named hereinabove, which assessment shall be in proportion to the benefits which will result from said tree trimming and maintenance.

Section 4. Said assessments shall be paid in three (3) annual installments upon the 1997, 1998, and 1999 duplicates for collections in the years 1998, 1999 and 2000, shall be certified to the County Auditor and placed upon the tax duplicate, according to law, and shall be collected as other taxes, provided, however, that property owner shall have the option of paying his assessments in cash within thirty (30) days from the passage of the ordinance levying such assessments.

Section 5. The Director of Finance of the City shall, immediately upon the passage of this resolution, proceed to make an assessment report assessing the cost of such tree trimming and maintenance upon the lands and lots abutting upon the above-

mentioned streets based upon an assessment of \$1.05 per front foot, in accordance with the benefits thereto, indicating the amount of the assessment as to each such lot or land. Corner parcels shall be assessed based upon the parcel's short side frontage plus one-half of the parcel's corner radius. Upon the filing of such report with Council, the Director of Finance shall cause publication of notice of the filing such report to be made once a week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Shaker Heights, as provided in Section 145.03 of the Administrative Code of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Shaker Heights. Any complaints against said assessments must be filed with the Board of Review of Assessments within two (2) weeks after completion of the publication of such notice.

Section 6. This resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety for the reason that it is necessary to provide for the continuation of the tree program of the City and to certify the assessments therefore within the time required by law, and this resolution shall, therefore, take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval by the Mayor.
